3. Principal's report — Andrea Greenhalgh

Terry Fox Run on Sept. 18 – our goal is to raise \$5,000 and we are just over \$1,400 (18 donations) as of this afternoon. You can go to Terry Fox Foundation and under 'Find Your

School' search Edith Cavell (Vancouver location). This is our 34th run. Cavell has cumulatively raised over \$130,000. Last week Terry Fox's niece came to the school and gave a speech

Open House on Sept. 18 after the Terry Fox Run. Come see your child's classroom and other areas of the school. This is not a time to talk to teachers about your child, but to see spaces in our school

First conferences with the teacher are on October 22 and 23 and dismissal is at 2:00 p.m. both days

 Ms. Fung needs volunteers for the book fair. It will run during the week of conferences and be open late on the Wednesday evening. The book fair is open in the morning, at lunch and after school and during conference nights

Clubs – over the past year many student-run clubs have been formed. We would like to give them some ownership of what they are doing so we're asking the PAC to have a small slush fund / donations that these students could "request" through a form/presentation to you

Foundation Skills Assessment – grades 4 and 7 will receive the FSA sometime in October or early November. These tests measure literacy and math at early grade 4 and early grade 7. The FSA is encouraged, but not mandatory. See attached slides for more



Online numeracy task	30 questions	60 minutes
Self-reflection	1 selected-response question and 1 written-response question	5 minutes

- Part of regular classroom learning
- No prep needed
- Spread over several days/weeks
